RT LEG

This case had been booked for one leg only and was technically challenging due to patient size. The common femoral, popliteal and posterior tibial veins were seen and compressed well throughout their length. The peroneal and anterior tibial veins were only seen at intermittent levels and compressed well in these places but the entire length was not seen. The sapheno popliteal and sapheno femoral junctions both appear competent. There is quite a large perforator seen crossing the tissue planes at 7 cm above the medial malleolus which is adjacent to the ulcerated area but no incompetence of this could be demonstrated. Two other small perforating veins were seen but these were also competent. If a further scan of the other leg is required this will need to be requested separately.
